ACTIVITIES AND TRAINING

Training sessions for NSEC Taekwondo happen three days a week during college days and also on weekends for about 2 hours or more in weekends. These sessions are held in the practice hall near the college gym beside the NSEC ground. The institute follows strict rules to maintain discipline.

- Members must bow to the instructor as a sign of respect when entering the practice hall.
- Everyone must wear the official Dobok
 (Taekwondo uniform) provided by the NSEC
 Taekwondo.
- Each and every player must arrive on time or before time for practice sessions.

- 2. **Training**: Practicing different kicking techniques and other Taekwondo moves. Many Poomsae are also taught with perfection.
- 3. Sparring: At the end of each training session players round up and gear up for controlled sparring which is held between two players.

ENROLMENT PROCESS FOR TAEKWONDO INSTITUTE
